



I knew Orkeeswa was unique the moment I stepped on campus. I developed an interest in Physics because my Physics teacher showed me the kind of a person I could be. I began spending more time with him and learned about wiring and putting things together and making them work. I began collecting electronic materials and scraps in the streets. One

time, I put them together and created a solar light. We used it at home.

I spent my lunch and breakfast breaks in the computer lab. I was curious. At the time Orkeeswa did not have a computer teacher so I taught myself. I began playing around with them and even accidentally changed the passwords on all of the computers. I got in trouble!

I started to see changes in myself when I got to 9th grade. I started thinking about my future and setting my goals. My Physics teacher introduced me to computer programming. He taught me a new language! Because he had other responsibilities, he left me on my own and I took the chance to teach myself the rest.

I started to learn robotics at Orkeeswa School. My favorite part was applying computer programming skills to make the machine move or do anything. This part was intense and fun, I liked it! I realized I could use computers to solve problems.

When I graduated, I pursued Computer Science in college. During my holidays, I went back to Orkeeswa and interned. I took charge of the computer lab and taught basic computer skills. Orkeeswa supported my passion for robotics and when I graduated from college, I became the Robotics Teacher

This opportunity keeps me busy and it has given me a lot of responsibilities like impacting the students the same way Orkeeswa impacted me. I am looking forward to bringing up students who can use their technology skills to transform our communities.

ORKEESWA OUTREACH

The local primary schools in Monduli district have historically performed in the bottom 15% nationally in academics and offer no life skills or extracurricular programming to their students due to limited resources. In Tanzania, only 53% of primary students matriculate to secondary school. The rate of matriculation is much lower in rural areas and for some of the schools in our Outreach Program, virtually 0% of girls advance to secondary school.


Orkeeswa Outreach partners with eight local primary schools, and is designed to extend our holistic model deeper into the community to build foundational skills that will:

 Improve retention and matriculation rates, especially among female students;

 Increase students' life, learning, and leadership skills;

 Equip local leaders to drive positive change in their communities, and;

 Address cultural norms in our community around gender discrimination and forced early marriage.

2022 Highlights


- Trained and placed an additional six full-time mentors in Outreach Primary Schools for a total of nine mentors.
- Hired a Mentor Coordinator & Director of Outreach
- Piloted one month of community service for Form 2 (8th Grade) students
- Began implementing the Teaching at the Right Level curriculum to primary students focused on foundational skills in literacy and numeracy; We assessed that 86% of students in grades 3-5 are below learning standards in math and 25% are below learning standards in literacy
- Implemented newly developed Life Skills curriculum in primary schools
- Constructed a new basketball court at Ngarash Primary School

Growth Opportunities

- Add two new primary schools each year beginning in 2024
- Fully implement Teaching at the Right Level
- Further develop Life Skills curriculum
- Formalize Leadership curriculum for student mentors
- Pilot Permaculture initiatives in the primary schools




In 2022, Evaline ranked as the top student in the district on her Form Four National Exams. She was the only girl in the district to rank in the top ten.

2022 Highlights

- Provided mentorship, networking or funding support to nine alumni for their projects
- Orkeeswa employs 27 alumni in various positions at Orkeeswa, with seven alumni serving in leadership roles

- Hired Incubator Coordinator to oversee alumni programming and support

- Develop customizable curriculum for the Incubator Fellowship program to offer budding alumni entrepreneurs with targeted support




My entrepreneurial journey commenced when I was eight years old and began helping my mom to sell fruit at a local market in Monduli. Entrepreneurship has taught me things that I couldn't learn in a conventional classroom. I've learned that only by asking the right questions – like "why" and "how" rather than just "what" – can we come up with practical solutions for the communities we want to help.

Entrepreneurship is more than a concept to me; it is a way of life that has instilled an eternal spirit of creativity and problemsolving. It has broadened my perspective on problems and compelled me to devise novel solutions, such as Primetel, my community's first digital healthcare platform. Access to essential diagnostic, prescriptive, and consultative healthcare services has long been a significant issue in my community, claiming hundreds of lives. Given the rapidly changing medical landscape, my village requires a more affordable, inclusive, and dynamic solution to usher it toward universal healthcare coverage. I designed an unstructured supplementary data survival application that links doctors and patients remotely without an internet connection. My mission through Primetel remains to radiate access to healthcare services across 40% of rural areas in Tanzania using the latest medical technological approaches by the end of 2030.

I recently had the opportunity to design and implement an eight-week entrepreneurial program for Orkeeswa students. The program birthed working projects and solutions that directly impacted the community, and it enabled students to hone the leadership, communications, critical thinking, and research skills that they will need. What amazes me the most is the unfailing approach of Orkeeswa School to avail opportunities such as the one I got to alumni and the community at large. It all starts with a shared belief that anything is possible.
